### Next Weekend's Retiring Collection is for Lepra (24<sup>th</sup>-25<sup>th</sup> January)

Lepra support people affected by leprosy and lymphatic filariasis. Leprosy is not a disease of the past and still occurs today in more than 120 countries, with over 200,000 new cases reported every year. Due to health inequalities and prejudice surrounding the disease, many people affected delay seeking treatment and if left untreated can cause disabilities. Lepra works with people to improve early detection, ensure access to treatment and care, and to promote inclusion and wellbeing.
